Aircraft "H" and "Z" of 200, both Leigh Light aircraft had intercepted the messages and arrived on the spot, and in response to R/T calls from "M" commenced searching with their lights. "Z" saw a possible patch of oil, though it was suggested that this might have been cloud shadow. Ten minutes after the attack the rear gunner sighted a dull green glow on water in the position of attack, this faded after 2 seconds and was not seen again. The hazy conditions in the moonlight were not conducive however to accurate and detailed observation, though it is virtually certain that the U-Boat was unaware of the aircraft's approach and it appeared to take no evasive action or make any attempt to dive. The Squadron C.O. considers that the U-Boat must have been seriously damaged and possibly sunk. He comments that H/200 was also manoeuvring to attack when "M" attacked, and did in fact observe the two contacts on the ASV screen converge and meet. No further contact was made following the attack.

			No Operations were carried out by this Squadron during the month of January. The non-operational period commenced on 27th December, 1944, for a span of 5 weeks, during which intensive Leigh Light training under S/L G. B. Gavin-Robinson, F/L. D. F. Redrup, and their crew was maintained. At the end of the month 4 crews were fully trained, and it was anticipated that, of the remaining 11, 9 further crews would have completed their training by 7th February, 1945. In addition to Radar Homing Exercises in conjunction with H.M.I.S. minesweepers "Poona" "Abandahad", Amritsar", and "Cuttack" and R.A.F. Pinnace 1326, and also practice bombing with the Mark III, Low Level Bombsight, an experiment in Night Bombing and Gunnery
			was carried out. Using a Marine Marker as target, a full scale Leigh Light attack was carried out and proved most successful. It will form the basis of future night training exercises.

			The intensive training programme undertaken revealed four difficulties of
			maintenance:-
			(a) Obtaining a supply of charged L.L. Batteries for Training needs.
			(b) Corrosion of aircraft caused by battery fumes.
			(c) Damage to aileron fabric by the buffeting of the slipstream past the rather crudely
			streamlined Leigh Light housing.
			(d) Difficulties associated with the methods of employing Radar in conjunction with
			Leigh Light involving a highly accurate alignment of the whole installations. Action
			is now being taken to overcome these difficulties.  Five aircraft have now been fitted with V.H.F. R/T, a decided asset. The advantages
			of this equipment over the equipment previously in use should greatly assist the Squadron in future operational and training commitments.
			One of the Squadron navigators, F/O. F. Stokes (Can.J.8734) has invented a Leigh
			Light Homing Protractor for use with Mark V. Radar Screen. It is a single protractor which gives the bearing against a fixed electrically illuminated scale marked in two
			degree divisions. The protractor is secured and centred by three screws, is easily
			installed or removed, and does not cover any part of the screen. When the Squadron begins Leigh Light operations the new protractor will be tested out and it is believed
			that it should prove very successful.

Jessore			As from the beginning of April the Squadron was moved to Jessore to assist other							
			squadrons in carrying out S.D. operations. The move of aircraft was completed by							
			April 5th and training for the new work commenced at once.							
			On April 15th the new type of operations were carried out for the first time when							
			three aircraft went out, a number that was increased to six on the eighteenth and							
			seven on the twentieth. The peak was reached on the twenty fourth, when nine							
			aircraft went out and eight of them completed their missions successfully.							
			The carrying out of nine operations in one day was facilitated by the arrival of a detachment from Cuttack with three aircraft on the 22nd April.							
			On the twenty sixth, seven aircraft went out and six were successful, the seventh							
			having to return to base owing to incorrect signals being shown at the target.							
			Subsequently it became policy to fly four aircraft per day.							
			In all fifty five operational missions were completed, forty seven of them being S.D.							
			work and the remaining eight being anti-shipping sweeps from Cuttack.							
			Of the forty seven S.D. operations, thirty four were successful and thirteen							
			unsuccessful, nine for weather reasons and the other four because of incorrect							
			reception over the target.							
			Abortive missions for weather reasons were mainly at the end of the month when a							
			marked deterioration in conditions in the target areas was experienced.							
			On April 29th very bad weather caused five aircraft out of seven to return to base							
			without delivering their loads. In several cases, crews reported actually sighting their							
			targets but being unable to approach them because of the presence of mountain peaks							
			obscured by heavy Cumulus cloud.							
			Three sorties of duration of approximately twenty hours were carried out and it was							
			unfortunate that two of them, both fling to the same target were forced to return to							
			base as no reception or signals were available over the D.Z.

-			By the 4th of the month 9 of the Unit's aircraft plus about 350 personnel had been							
			moved by air from Madras to the Squadron's new location Jessore. 60 other personne							
			were en route on this day either by rail or by road escorting essential equipment in							
			each case. The remainder of the personnel remained at St. Thomas Mount Madras.							
			Health and Welfare.							
			Both the ingenuity, and patience of Officers and men concerned was severely taxed in							
			establishing 400 personnel at Jessore. Innumerable difficulties had to be faced,							
			difficulties which it is considered, should have been smoothed out before the Unit							
			arrived, particularly in view of the 12 days' notice of our arrival which had been							
			given.							
			Accommodation, mostly tentage was being erected as the first aircraft came into the

were given barely 24 hours notice of our arrival with resultant disorganization for 3

Sanitation left a great deal to be desired. The Flight area latrines were not cleaned out
in spite of my request, until they had been in use for a fortnight. Action at last being
taken on the day of the visit of the A.O.C. 231 Group. The unit staff took action to
provide a more hygienic latrine. The health of the Squadron during the month was
below the average. Nearly all the personnel in tentage suffered in some form or
another because of the damp conditions.  Six Gharries (3 tonners) and 3 15 Cwts only were provided for the Sqdn's use. The
six gharries had to cope with operational work, crews for briefings etc, flights
requirements, conveying airmen to and from the domestic camp (5 miles each way),
and the various essential duty runs. Conditions were aggravated by one gharry going
u/s the first day and 2 the next day. The M.T. on arrival at Jessore was in very poor
condition (it was the subject of a special report by the Station Engineer Officer
Jessore) and all through the month the Unit was managing with great difficulty and
much inconvenience with either 2, 3, or 4 gharries only per day.
It says much for the Squadron spirit, tested to the limit, in spite of the satisfaction at
the knowledge of the importance of the Squadron's new role, that the end of the
month saw a good job done both by ground personnel and aircrew.

There was little time for organised sports. Two representation games only were
played during the month.
Entertainment.
The only facilities available were the Cinema in Jessore but, owing to the shortage of
M.T., organized runs to the village were not possible. There was no canteen for the
Unit, though 136 R.S.U. threw open their canteen to a limited number of the
Squadron personnel each night. The same Unit also arranged for the Squadron two
shows by their own concert party.

great progress of land operations in Burma was followed with keen interest by all
ranks.
