Jessore	February	1945	Part I – Operations
			The month of February 1945 saw a further increase in the number of sorties
			flown by 357 (S.D.) Sqdn. However this was only to be expected due to the
			increasing requirements of the Sponsoring Forces & the almost daily
			expansion of the Squadron. An advance of 19 sorties was made on our
			previous best month January 1945; for in all 124 sorties were flown. The
			percentage of successes was very similar to last month, being 73% against
			75% during January. No doubt this figure would have been higher, but for the
			fact that extremely bad weather was encountered over Dropping Zones in
			Burma & French Indo-China during the period Feb 11th to Feb 21st. This is
			easily shown by the number of unsuccessful sorties sue to bad weather mad
			on "Operation Bazaar" in French Indo-China. 10 sorties were made on this
			target during the period stated, & with the exception of one of these being
			unsuccessful due to technical trouble developing in the aircraft, all were
			unsuccessful due to the fact that 10/10 Cu cloud was encountered over the
			Dropping area. After Feb 21st however, all further sorties made on this target
			were successful, due to the solitary fact that the belt of bad weather, which
			had been covering this area, had lifted.
			Statistics show that of the 124 sorties flown, 90 were entirely successful, 19
			were unsuccessful owing to no reception being seen over the target are, 13
			were unsuccessful due to bad weather (mainly 10/10 ths cloud) being
			experienced over the D.Z., 1 was unsuccessful due to a Navigation failure & 1
			was unsuccessful due to technical trouble developing in the aircraft.
			The work the Squadron performed was as hitherto, an amalgamation of the
			requirements of the Sponsoring Forcers namely – I.S.L.D., Force 136, 'Z'
			Force, "D" Division, O.S.S., & 'E' Group. whose requirements were detailed in
			brief last month.
			The Squadron's aircraft operated mainly over Burma, but it would be
			noteworthy to add that there was a great increase of sortie flown over French
			Indo-China but these were on a smaller scale to those previously mentioned.
			The month was marred by the unfortunate crash of Aus.421464 W/O J. W.
			Reid & Crew who were operating in a Dakota KJ927 on "Cloak?" on a day
			light sortie on Feb 10th. The mission was carried out successfully, but
			extremely bad weather was encountered over the Chin Hills on the return
			flight & although no details are yet to hand, it is thought that the a/c must have
			become uncontrollable & crashed in the vicinity of Muint Victoria (10,018 ft.) There were three other Dakotas on this target at the same time as W/O. Reid
			& the other crews reported seeing W/O Reid leave the target & s/c Base,
			which is the last that was seen of him. The pilots of the other Dakotas reported that the only way they were able to return to Base was by flying at
			15,000' & avoiding cloud patches at that height over the Chin Hills.
