	Monsoon conditions prevailed and the number of sorties mounted during the
	month was less by 20 than the total for May. The percentage of successful
	missions was lower accordingly; 43.9% representing the lowest monthly figure
	since the squadron has been operating.
	While many A/c were able to get well within their target area, only to find D.Zs
	obscured by low cloud, bad weather was also encountered all along routes
	between base and targets. Consequently several sorties were comparatively
	short-lived, and one captain, F/S. Gwinnell, finding himself encircled by violent
	storms, force landed his Liberator in a paddy field on the mainland east of
	Ramree Island on the 14th. All members of the crew survived the landing
	without injury and after being several days with natives, who took them to the
	coast in boats, they were picked up by Catalina.
	Three other aircraft were also lost on operations but with less fortunate results
	for the crews. On 12th Jun F/Sgt. Hodgson and his crew of eight were killed
	when he crashed on take-off. On the same day F/Sgt. Staines crashed near
	Fenni with the result that five of the crew were killed, one died form injuries and
	two were seriously injured. During an operation on the 19th F/O Anderson's A/c
	was reported missing and has not been heard of since.
	One operation over French Indo China was made abortive by enemy action.
	Arriving over his D.Z. area at 0154 hours 1st July, F/O. Outram's aircraft was
	attacked by two or three enemy fighters from astern. Violent evasive action was
	taken with the aid of cloud and although it was reported that the E/A opened fire
	on their initial attack, no hits were received by the Liberator. Flying in and out of
	cloud on a westerly course, the A/c kept out of reach of the Oscars and at 0340
	hours F/O. Outram decided to jettison containers and make a run for base. It
	would appear that this order may have been misunderstood by the despatcher,
	F/O. Cook, for two minutes later it was found that he and the six passengers
	who were to have dropped on the D.Z., had disappeared from the A/C. Later a
	report was heard from the field revealed that six had landed safely, nothing
	having been heard of one of the passengers
