			Operational Summary for October.

358 Squadron October 1945

	This month the successes have been very high the highest since the formation of 358 Squadron. Mainly due to D.Zs being more exposed and excellent weather. Owing to disturbances in F.I.C. after cessation of hostilities, our supply dropping has been confined to the borders of F.I.C. Particular care had to be taken to ensure no violations of this order, and no reports of violation by the crews from this Squadron have been received. The last of the P.O.W. supply drops was completed at the beginning of the month. Owing to movement of P.O.Ws being executed very rapidly, the number of P.O.W. drops was decreased considerably. The bulk of the remaining drops was confined to isolated parties in the field. Photographs were taken on a number of occasions and excellent drops were observed in this way. The first real proof since the squadron began operating. There were no operational casualties for this month. One aircraft was lost on a training flight, there were three survivors. On October 25th operations ceased owing to transfer of Squadron upon disbanding. This order however was cancelled and the Squadron is expected to be fully operational by the
	beginning of November.
